




## FROM PAST PRESIDENT T JABLANSKI



## **GFWC MA Credentials Conservation Effort**

At each state Meeting or Convention members attending are asked to return their plastic name badges, The paper content can also be recycled along with the plastic holder. As your 2022-2024 Chairman I have been monitoring the return rate. Did you know we achieve about a 68-70% return rate - not great - a grade of C if we were being graded in school. We CAN do better!

Why worry? Over the course of an administration this means we need to buy another box of 100 name badge holders to replace those lost. Not only is non-recyclable plastic ending up in multiple waste streams in our state, but it costs GFWC MA about \$90 each time to replace lost plastic holders. That money could go to a better cause than replacing plastic holders!

As your Credentials Chairman for 2024-2026, I am asking each of you to not only be sure to return your own badge and its paper contents, but to make sure a fellow attendee does as well. The goal: a 100% return rate - a lofty A+ goal, but why not. Helping our Earth and our own finances are worthy causes, don't you agree???



## **Women's Club Certificates for Best Projects**

## GFWC SPECIAL AND COMMUNITY PROGRAM

#### **Domestic Violence and Sexual Abuse Awareness**

## 1st Place ~ Bay State Contemporary Club

The club contributed 48 hours of their time to donate cash and goods to three different local organizations dedicated to supporting the needs and services for victims of Domestic and Sexual Violence as well as Human Trafficking.

## **Advocates for Children**

## 1<sup>st</sup> Place ~ Braintree Women's Club

As a thank you to the local library for allowing the club's Board of Directors to conduct their business meeting at the facility the club donated \$200. At the request of the club the donation was used for the purchase of books for grammar and middle school children spotlighting Women in History.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Place ~ Holly Club of Wrentham

10 members donated 34 hours of their time and partnered with the Wrentham Food Bank to purchase and package 27 pairs of pajamas for 13 families totaling \$350.

## **Arts And culture**

Presented a program that demonstrated how to recycle old jewelry into purse jewelry.

## **Civic Engagement**

## 1<sup>st</sup> Place ~ Braintree Women's Club

Donated \$630 worth of various requested items packaged in tote bags to the residents of Caritas House, a local transitional house for the homeless.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Place ~ Holly Club

10 Members donated 25 hours of their time and the club donated \$200 towards providing a dinner for all the first responders in their community.

## 1<sup>st</sup> Place ~ Hopkinton Women's Club

Members donated 154 hours and \$9100 providing scholarships and various educational opportunities in their community.
